WEEKLY WORDS FROM THE ROCK:

Weekly Words from The Rock:

Who am I?

Jesus in today's gospel takes the disciples to Caesarea Philippi and poses the question, "Who do people say that I am?" The disciples respond Elijah, John the Baptist, or one of the prophets. If I returned to my home roots of Freeborn, Minnesota and asked the people who knew me during my school years the same question Jesus asked his disciples, the following would be some of their responses:

- 1. Peter grew up on a farm two miles southwest of Freeborn.
- 2. His parents were Lowell and Bonnie Schuster.
- 3. He had three siblings Christine, Mary, and Mark.
- 4. He enjoyed fishing and hunting.
- 5. He played football and baseball.
- 6. He was an okay student when it came to his studies.
- 7. He always talked about wanting to be a priest.
- 8. He was a friendly sort.
- 9. He went to a university no one has ever attended from Freeborn St. John's University in Collegeville, Minnesota.
- 10. He rarely got into trouble.
- 11. His nicknames were the Pope and Terminator.

All the above statements would have been true. As we know in today's famed gospel, Jesus next turns the question end for end, "But who do you say that I am?" Peter's response left no doubt, "You are the Messiah." The statement is a statement as true as any of the eleven I posed regarding myself. However, it is at this point that everything takes a different stroke. In the next passage, Jesus teaches that he must suffer, be rejected, killed, and rise three days later. If you were to ask any of the people who knew me how my future looked, speculation would have been the name of the game. They may have said something like this, "He talks about wanting to be a priest so he will probably become a priest." While there is a direction in these words, there isn't certainty. "Probably" does not equate to certainty. Jesus' words carry weight and certainty. I will,

- A. Suffer
- B. Be rejected
- C. Be killed (notice he doesn't say die but killed)
- D. Rise after three days

And that is what sets Jesus apart. His words, whether present or future, are truth. They are on point! May we heed his words and follow his words to eternal life.
