WEEKLY WORDS FROM THE ROCK:

Chance

The reality of living in this world is that all things come to us in all their beauty only to be snatched from us. Here is one such story. Some twenty-five years ago, my brother brought home a new little puppy. It was a mix of black lab and German shepherd. He named the dog "Chance" because as he noted, "I am taking a chance on this dog."

Let us jump ahead a couple years. I decided to walk along a creek in search of ducks. Dogs being dogs, Chance had to come along. As I walked along, no ducks exploded from the water below; however, well into our excursion, ahead of me, and I mean way ahead of me, I could see a hen pheasant run. When Chance got her eyes on the pheasant, she was off to the races. We didn't have a shock collar on her so all I could do was watch. I got to where I last saw her, heard a noise in the bottom of the creek, when up explodes a rooster pheasant. I fire and miraculously, it falls out of the sky. As quickly as I wish the dog were there to retrieve the rooster, Chance runs out from the bottom of the creek and heads for the downed bird in the cornfield which happens to be on the opposite side of the creek. It was obvious, without me being able to see her, Chance was the "noise" in the bottom of the creek, had flushed the rooster, and when I shot, watched the bird tumble from the sky. I waited and waited. I called and called. It took a while, but she finally came with the rooster in tow.

I wish I could say that everything went perfect from that point forward, but it didn't. There was water in the bottom of the creek and a barrier she somehow never noted with the falling of the bird, now became a major obstacle. She wouldn't cross the creek, no way. Chance always was a little leery of water. It took some time, but I finally managed to coax her across. Before crossing the creek, she dropped the rooster. I tried sticks and anything else I could get my hands on, but I couldn't reach the rooster. The divide across the creek was too far.

There was only one thing to do – walk 3/8 of a mile, cross the creek on a driveway, and walk back the 3/8 of a mile on the other side of the creek. As I walked along, I was happy but dumbfounded. I asked myself, could this be? We couldn't possibly have a hunting dog when all of a sudden Chance dashes into the standing corn next to me. It doesn't take long until I see pheasants flying out the end of the field. I race to the end of the field and watch pheasant after pheasant running and flying. One big rooster comes charging out of the field and looks back wondering what they black "thing" is chasing him. Feeling safe, the rooster turns his head, prepares to run only to see me. I've been there the entire time only about ten yards away. He didn't know I was there too worried about that "thing" chasing him. The rooster flies and falls at my shot. Chance comes bolting out of the standing corn. I point out the rooster still moving around and what does she do? She goes up to it and gives it a big old chomp. Not a retrieve, just a chomp. It would be her characteristic trait – any pheasant you cleaned that as much as flopped or moved on the ground after the shot would have big teeth marks in it. She was not known to have a soft mouth.

No matter, we had a hunting dog. Not gun shy, I took her on many pheasant outings. I would define her as follows: she was never meant to be a pointer, she never wore a shock collar thus some birds would be flushed a half mile away and when flushed, she would look back and wonder where you were, she loved chasing rabbits as much as pheasants (meaning sometimes you just had to wait). Through it all, a lot of birds were harvested with her in tow. And that is when it happened, in 2012, someone drove up into our yard at night and stated they'd run over a dog. Upon further investigation, it was Chance and there was nothing we could do. As soon as she came into the world, she left the world. I miss her to this very day.

The reality of the story is that nothing lasts forever, not even you or me. The world as we know it will come to an end. Still, Advent reminds us that during our time on earth to be vigilant for Jesus Christ will come in all his glory and power to reign forever. Let us pray for vigilance, to be prepared.
