WEEKLY WORDS FROM THE ROCK:

Reflections on My Father Surrounding Christmas and Holy Family

This bulletin article will encompass the next two weeks – December 22nd and December 29th. With my father's death on November 8th, I want to share with you a reflection on my father surrounding Christmas and the Feast of the Holy Family. Let us get underway.

My Sincere Gratitude

It is humbling to lose a parent. One believes a parent will always be there until they pass away. I have been stunned, not in a bad way, at the outpouring of God's people at my father's death. The number of people who have stopped me to offer their condolences is beyond any number I could have conceived. A priest never realizes the people he touches until an occasion like this. People have reached out to me from my seven parishes along with numerous other parishes I have served. It has been humbling. I am grateful to everyone. I am grateful to those who have offered condolences, prayers, cards, and gifts. To those of you who have sent a gift asking that a Mass be offered, I have been faithful to your requests. It will take some time however the Masses will be offered.

A Memorial To My Father

I have been in discussion with my mother and sister who live at home, and it has been decided that the monetary gifts offered on behalf of my father (outside of Mass intentions) will be used to purchase a workbench for the garage at home. I enjoy tinkering around with various things however have no workbench on which to undertake this work. My mother and sister were thrilled at the idea. The bench will include a workspace six feet in length and two feet in width. It includes two drawers, the capacity to plug in power cords and USB ports, a shelf located underneath the bench and will be mobile (on wheels) so it can be moved from one location to another. Someone has kindly provided a vise which can be attached to the bench. I am still debating whether I should include a bench grinder. We will wait and see. To all who have made this possible know of my sincere gratitude.

Christmas

With the loss of my father, Christmas takes on a special meaning. The story of Christmas really comes to life. Jesus Christ came to us to suffer and die for our sins. My father was a faith-filled man. He lived a simple yet deep faith. He didn't need to read Bible passages every day. He believed in what Jesus Christ said, taught and lived. He never doubted even when times were difficult. It takes time yet as we age, we learn our parents aren't perfect. Just like everyone who walks this earth, me included, my father wasn't perfect; he sinned. It is for someone like my father that Jesus was born in Bethlehem. To him, Jesus' words were, "Lowell, my father's name, I know that you were not perfect. You have sinned. Still, if you believe in me and confess your need for me, I will bring you life." My father knew that he was a sinner. He faithfully celebrated the Sacrament of Penance. His example was an example for me. If my father was a sinner, how dare I think differently of myself. For people to be convinced in these current times that "my sin isn't that big a deal" is an injustice to the Christmas story. Jesus Christ came did not come so we could have an excuse to decorate our homes, gather as family, or purchase gifts. Jesus Christ came because of our pain and suffering. He knew what sin had done to us.

Holy Family

To face sin, evil, the devil, Jesus Christ was born to a human family. Jesus, Mary, and Joseph compose the Holy Family. They faced joys and hardships, the ebb and flow of living on this earth. It is different without my father being with us. I look at where he sat in his chair and he isn't there. I look at his place at table and he isn't there. I look at where he sat in the garage (where we will incorporate a new workbench) and he isn't there. Life is different still it is beyond a shadow of a doubt that I believe my father is in heaven. Maybe some of that stems from the fact that a person doesn't want to think differently or because he is my father, still I firmly believe he is with God. He lived his faith and knew the day would come when he would pass from this world. He was ready and prepared. It is now left up to the remainder of us, his family, to live that faith so that we can live with him eternally.

A Concluding Thought

With the death of someone we love, time can be ruthless. We may wish it to halt but it grinds forward. There is also a good in this fact. No one desires time to halt. Our faith teaches us forward we march. We find ourselves at the end of our year 2024. To all the condolences, prayers, cards and gifts that I have received at my father's passing and around this Christmas season, I am very grateful. Know of my prayers for all of you as I "tinker" away at my new workbench and serve you in 2025.
